#### Pax Christi Metro New York (PCMNY):

PCMNY was founded in 1983 and is a regional section of Pax Christi USA (PCUSA), a member of the international Catholic peace movement dedicated to Gospel nonviolence and Catholic social teachings on peace and justice. It is also an agency of Catholic Charities in the Archdiocese of New York.

### <u>The PCMNY Mission Statement expresses</u> that we should strive to be...

Rooted in Gospel nonviolence and Catholic Social Teaching, Pax Christi Metro New York (PCMNY) educates and advocates for peace and social justice locally and globally through prayer, study, and action.

Pax Christi's Approach to Peacemaking is Contemplative, Informed Active, and Celebratory.



<u>Prayer:</u> As people of faith, our peacemaking must be centered in the Spirit. The community of PCMNY strengthens itself in the Spirit by organizing:

- A Good Friday Way of the Cross—Hundreds of Christians gather to pray a contemporary Stations of the Cross, witnessing to the body of Christ as it is torn and crucified today.
- An Annual weekend retreat to challenge and nurture participants in their commitment to Christian nonviolence.
- An Annual 40-day Fast for Christian nonviolence
- Weekly Bulletin Inserts that relate each Sunday's scripture readings to contemporary living
- Liturgies for solidarity with those who labor for peace

Study: Waging peace demands an understanding of the complex world in which we live. We are committed to educating our community and ourselves in a variety of ways. We host noteworthy speakers and thought-provoking discussions at annual events:

- UN International Peace Day
- Fall Assembly
- Human Rights Day/Holy Innocents
- Hiroshima/Nagasaki Memorial

We offer workshops and other educational programs to parishes and schools:

- First Steps: A Christian Conflict Resolution Process—Rooted in scripture, First Steps helps participants develop nonviolent conflict resolution skills.
- From Conflict to Common Ground—A program similar to First Steps for students in Catholic high schools
- Seventy Times Seven—A workshop on forgiveness
- Just War/Just Peace—A high school program that explores responsible citizenship, patriotism, and service in light of various faith teachings on war and peace
